Appeal by BAE on the refusal of the development of a mixed use employment and retail centre

The Parish Council made representation, at the recent appeal by BAE, to ensure that this development did not have an adverse impact on the local retail outlets.

The Council was pleased that the appeal was dismissed by the Inspector and one of the reasons given was that the development could not be accommodated without an adverse impact on some local centres.

Proposed Dog Control Order – Memorial Park

The Parish Council wish to clarify that Fylde Borough Council has not yet made a decision on whether the Dog Order should be progressed.

The Council would like to point out that this Dog Control Order is intended to replace the Byelaw, introduced by FBC in 1996, that restricts dogs to be on a lead in a number of areas in the Borough, including the Memorial Park in Freckleton. FBC has not indicated that this Byelaw will be repealed if the new Order is not progressed.

The same Byelaw states that dogs are banned from the Rose Garden, (now known as the Memorial Garden), in the Memorial Park in Freckleton.
