As all parishioners should now be aware, there is a slot at the beginning of each Council meeting for the public to air their views on any matter relating to the Parish council.

In the past, we have received complaints of motorist using the car park on School lane as a short cut onto Preston Old road. This is particularly dangerous at school times The Council, with the agreement of the Governors of the C of E school and Fylde Borough Council, are progressing changes to the car park to allow a safe drop off and pick up zone within the car park and to make it more difficult for cars to speed through the car park.

The Steering Group have now completed the inputting of the Questionnaire responses. This has been no mean feat and has taken well over 300 person-hours to complete.

The next step is to proceed with discussions with the service providers from Fylde Borough Council, Lancashire County Council, NHS and the Lancashire Constabulary, on the results arising from the questionnaire and plan the way forward.

To this end, there will be an Open Day on the 18th February, 10.30 am to 9.00pm in the Village Memorial Hall, when the results obtained from the questionnaire will be on public display. The various service providers, including Freckleton Parish Council, will also be

mounting their own displays, which will give you a chance to obtain first hand information, and make your views known.

Following the Open Day, the Steering Group will proceed to the final stage of the Parish Plan, when actions are agreed with the service providers and Freckleton Parish Council. The final plan will be supplied to every household in the Parish sometime late June this year.

In spite of widespread advertising, thirteen prizes for the Grand Draw, remain unclaimed. It is intended, to hold another draw associated with the Open Day for all those prizes still unclaimed by the end of January

Public Right of Ways

Following complaints regarding the state of the public right of ways within the village the Council have requested that the Lancashire County Council carry out the necessary work to make all the public footpaths more easily accessible. Meetings are being arranged with representatives from LCC and it is hoped that with the help of volunteers from the village this work will be carried out in the Spring.

Community Learning Partnership

Representatives from the Council have attended a meeting on the need to promote vocational and non-vocational education at local level. There has been a large drop in the number of evening classes held at Carr Hill and the aim of the meeting was to build a Community Learning partnership to promote education at local level. Monies are available for adult training from various sources.
