

Neighbourhood Watch Freckleton PACT Update

Below are the results from the April PACT (police and communities together) meeting.

Priorities for Freckleton area

- Faded road markings on Lytham Rd outside the Co-Op late shop.
- Various damage related incidents along Kirkham Rd

Update on the previous months issues

Speeding issues on the A584 around the junction of Lower Lane Freckleton: The speeding issue is being looked at as a joint problem within Warton and Freckleton by the NHP team. A representative from the council has been to assess the locations identified for the SPID device so at this stage the team are now awaiting the relevant brackets to be fitted to the lamp posts and training to be carried out.

Youth nuisance memorial park and naze lane area: Several incidents over the last month involving youths in the village have been dealt with positively by the NHP team including:

Damage to window at residential home – Youth responsible found and received a caution as well as paying for cost of repair.

Littering – Youths responsible for littering an area with leaflets were identified and made to do a litter pick as well as receiving youth referrals.

Anti-social Behaviour Agreements – One youth signed up and has not caused any problems since, and another youth is in the pipeline.

Youths causing problems around Strike Lane school – 3 Youths spoken to by officer in front of head of school and all received youth referrals.

Talks carried out at both primary schools in Freckleton covering subjects such as bullying, damage, and theft. Feedback has been very positive
