Chairman's Annual Report 2018

Congratulations to Freckleton in Bloom and Golden Leaf for achieving a Gold award in the North West in Bloom competition.

A lot of planning and hard work goes into winning these awards and I thank the local businesses for their support. In addition, I would point out that this is an initiative that I would encourage all that live in the Village to participate in.

We are grateful and thank County Councillor Paul Rigby LCC for ensuring the Library was opened promptly when LCC decided that it had changed its policy on the closing of Libraries. To date it is a very popular venue for Villagers to meet and use. Long may it do so.

Again, it is disappointing to report that there has been a considerable reduction in the Policing of the Village. We have a good working relationship with them and we are making the best of what they can offer. The Police have recently started 5 PCSOs in the Fylde area. This is a step in the right direction

In October 2017 Fylde Borough Council introduced new Public Space Protection Orders (PSPO) to replace the existing Bye-laws and Dog Control Orders. The full details of these new Orders can be found on the FBC's web-site.

The Parish Council is considering upgrading the CCTV system in the Memorial park. Further information will be available when a decision has been made.

The Parish Council is liaising with the Churches to organise an event to mark the 100th Anniversary of WW1. Details will be available nearer the time.

The Parish Council is proud of its Sports and Community groups of which the Bowling, Football and Cricket clubs sets good examples. The Football section, under the management of Paul Martland, is progressing well and we are grateful to all who are involved in making a success of our Sports facilities.

Both the Horticultural and Agricultural allotments, with their own Management committees, are to be proud of and set a good example of how community groups can work together.

We have supported the Village hall in keeping it a place to be proud of and my thanks go to the Management committee.

Freckleton Club day committee are to be thanked for all the great work they do for the Village. They work very hard throughout the year. I commend the Parish Council's support for them.
